4. How FPHA can support local communities advancing health equity and CLAS.

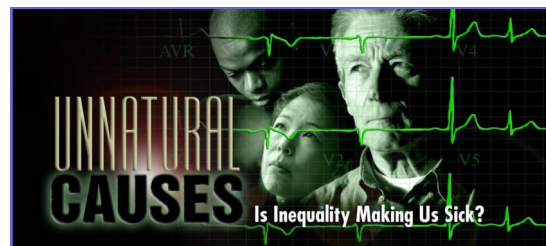
