Eligibility for Free Mammogram Screenings

Must meet each of the four criteria below:

- 1. Women ages 50-64
 - Women ages 40-49 with a parent, sister, brother, or child that's had breast cancer
- 2. Have a household income that is less than or equal to 200% of the poverty level
- 3. Have no health insurance to cover the cost of a clinical breast exam, mammogram, or Pap smear
- 4. Primary residence is in Florida
